PASTORAL LETTER OF MAY

Dear Friends in Christ,

After the sign of peace, there's a special moment that's all about unity and togetherness. We all say or sing "Lamb of God" together while the presider breaks the bread, just like how Jesus fed a whole crowd with just a few loaves. It's a reminder of something amazing: when many grains of wheat become flour, they lose their individual identities to become one loaf. And just like how grapes are crushed and mixed to become one wine, Jesus, through His death and resurrection, brought us all together as one.

Then comes another important part of communion. The presider holds the host slightly above the chalice and says, "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." This is the church's way of telling us that nothing can harm us because Jesus has already defeated sin and death. Death is just a door that leads us to an incredible feast, where we will be united with Christ and all the saints in heaven.

Now it's time to go to the altar and receive the Bread of Life. We're encouraged to treat communion like a family meal, where everyone is welcome and valued. We're reminded that we are all part of the Body of Christ, and that we all have a place at His table.

We're even encouraged to sing as we go up to receive communion. The idea is to show that we're all connected and happy to share this moment. It's not only about Jesus; it's also about appreciating each other.

When we sing together, we express our joy and gratitude for the gift of unity that Jesus has given us. We lift our voices as one, praising God for His goodness and mercy.

Once we've all received the bread, we're invited to pray quietly for a while. This is when we can feel Jesus in our hearts without saying a word. It's like catching a glimpse of heaven. In these moments of silence, we can let the peace and love of Christ wash over us, filling us with a sense of calm and contentment.

We understand that when we leave the church, we're back in the imperfect world, where division and violence sometimes exist. But for now, we set all of that aside and enjoy the peace and unity we experience when we're with Christ. We feel it deep within our souls, a peace that surpasses all understanding.

Because of this incredible experience, we're inspired to go out into the world and work towards bringing that same peace and unity everywhere. The peace we feel during Mass isn't just for us; it's a taste of what we should strive to create in our families, workplaces, schools, and communities. We're called to be ambassadors of Christ, spreading His message of love and reconciliation wherever we go.

Yes, the world isn't perfect, but guess what? Jesus has already emerged victorious. The moments of peace and unity we experience in church empower us to go out and make the world a better place. We become stewards of Christ's kingdom, responsible for spreading love, truth, and unity in every aspect of our lives, whether it's in politics, religion, or our everyday actions.

CARTA PASTORAL DE MAYO

Queridos amigos en Cristo,

Después de la señal de la paz, tenemos unos momentos especiales que tienen que ver con unidad y convivencia. RESTORATION PROJECT

Our Stations of the Cross are truly magnificent works of art. The 14 panels, each measuring 4 ½ x 9 feet, were commissioned by the founding Pastor of St. Rose, Monsignor Paul Pieri. Specifically designed for our church which was built in 1962, the stations were hand carved in Italy where Fr. Pieri served as a military chaplain during World War II. The panels were created from linden wood, which is a soft wood that is well suited to intricate carvings such as our Stations.

As with any wooden object, care must be taken to preserve and protect the wood since it will dry out over time. If you have attended Mass recently, I hope you noticed that our Stations were recently restored. They were restored by a talented local woodworker. He and his team conducted a three-step process of restoration: cleaning, oiling and sealing. The work took his professional team several days to complete, and the cost of their services was \$10,840.

We received a generous donation that covered \$5,000 of the cost. That was such a blessing. It is our hope that we can raise the balance of the funds from parishioners' donations. If you would be willing to assist with this project, please consider "sponsoring" one station for \$417, but contributions of any amount will be greatly appreciated. If we have 14 sponsors, our balance will be fully supported. Please make your online payment or check to St. Rose of Lima Church, and on the memo line write "Stations Restoration". CCE CORNER

The St. Rose of Lima Family community celebrated with 140 of our children who received First Communion this past weekend. It truly was a celebration with all three First Communion Masses filled with the families and friends of these kids who, along with their parents and our St. Rose of Lima Sacramental Preparation Team have worked for the last two years in preparing everyone to celebrate this milestone day. Even with all the excitement, there are a few things we should remember. First, the journey of faith is not a moment in time...a celebration on a certain day. The preparation of these children and the actual celebrations are just moments in time. The journey of faith is lifelong. Each year, the CCE office will get calls from parents of children who have just made their First Communion asking if the children will no longer need to continue in CCE Classes. I will answer that question by identifying what the letters CCE stand for. Continuing Christian Education. Sacramental Preparation Programs and CCE classes are two separate and distinct programs. The children who received First Communion this weekend have, for the most part a second grade understanding of the Eucharist. As they systematically continue to attend CCE classes, they will continue to be formed in their understanding of the Sacrament that is the Source and Summit of our faith at a grade and age appropriate level. Don't be a minimalist parent when it comes to faith formation of your children. These second graders are still infants on this wonderful journey. Please do all you can to make sure they don't get lost or sidetracked on their journey of faith.

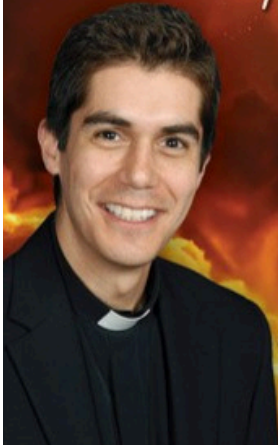

NOTIFICACIÓN DEL TRIBUNAL METROPOLITANO ARQUIDIOCESANO

La Iglesia es muy consciente del dolor del divorcio, y de la gran necesidad que tienen los divorciados y vueltos a casar de contar con la presencia sanadora de Jesús en sus vidas. Con esto en mente, nos gustaría informarles del Programa de Patrocinio de Casos de Nulidad del Tribunal. El final de un matrimonio es una experiencia difícil, y el divorcio es una de las tragedias de la vida. Muchos matrimonios terminan en divorcio a pesar de las buenas intenciones y el establecimiento de una familia. La Iglesia Católica es sensible al dolor y al estrés que una relación matrimonial fracasada supone para todos los implicados. Una de las principales funciones del Tribunal Metropolitano de la Archidiócesis de Galveston-Houston es ayudar a las personas que solicitan una posible anulación. Desafortunadamente, hay muchos conceptos erróneos acerca de las anulaciones en la Iglesia Católica.
